C. **Flashcard 5-3** (Mark 10:46;
Luke 18:35-37)

1. It was time for the special
feast and many people
traveled through Jericho to
get to Jerusalem.
2. Someone told Bartimaeus
that Jesus was coming.



D. **Flashcard 5-4** (Mark 10:47-49a;
Luke 18:38-40a)

1. Bartimaeus called out to
Jesus for mercy.
2. Jesus immediately
stopped walking.

to show mercy to you.

E. **Flashcard 5-5** (Mark 10:49b-52a;
Luke 18:40b-42)

1. Jesus told Bartimaeus to
come to Him.

🕯️ Jesus is perfect and
didn't deserve to die,
but He willingly bled
and died so that you
could be forgiven.
[Colossians 1:13-14]

2. Bartimaeus told Jesus that he wanted to see.
3. He believed Jesus was the promised Savior and could
take away his blindness.
