

# Teaching the Song

**Introduction:** Guess what I ate for breakfast! (*Allow response.*) Guess what my house looks like! (*Allow response.*) Guess what I am thinking right now! (*Allow response.*) Guessing can be tricky, can't it? There is something so important that God would never want you to have to guess about it.

**Presentation:** (*Sing the song for the children while showing the visual.*)

**Explanation:** God wants you to have a relationship with Him! He tells you how in the Bible. The Bible is true and can be trusted. Jesus is the Savior that God promised to send to Earth. Because He is the Son of God, He showed what God is like. He is perfectly holy. He knows everything, so you don't have to be afraid of the future. He is the Mighty King, so you can trust him to take care of you. These are just a few of the words that describe Jesus. Jesus loved you so much that He died on the cross to take your punishment for sin and make way for you to be a friend of God. It's not a mystery. It's not a puzzle. It's God's truth from the Bible.

**Application:** *Unsaved:* If you've never trusted in Jesus, you can trust in Him today. God does not want you to be confused about it. If you have questions about Jesus, talk to me after the Bible lesson and I would be happy to show you more from the Bible.

*Saved:* If you have already believed in Jesus as your Savior, get to know Jesus better! As you read your Bible, look for other words that describe Jesus. Listen when someone teaches about Jesus. Not only did He save you from sin's punishment, but He will give you joy as you think of Him! Getting to know Jesus more and more is the best thing you could ever do!

**Repetition:** (*Have children sing the song twice with you. Note that there is an echo of J-E-S-U-S in the chorus of the song. Have the children shout out J-E-S-U-S as you sing "Who can see everything?" and "Who is the Mighty King?" The second time, have the children sing the lyrics and the teaching team shout out J-E-S-U-S.*)
