D. **Slide 4** (Bible Map)



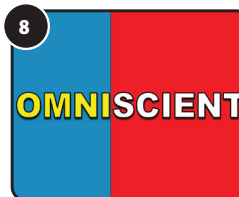
E. **Slide 5**

- K. **Slide 11** (1 Samuel 16:11)
1. David was a shepherd.
 2. David hurried to his father's house.



L. **Slide 12** (1 Samuel 16:12)

1. God could see David's heart because God is omniscient.
2. God told Samuel to anoint David.
3. David was a man after God's heart.



- M. **Slide 13** (Word Up!)
-  When you love God, the Holy Spirit will work in you to help you obey Him. [Psalm 139:23-24]



- N. **Slide 14** (1 Samuel 16:12)
Samuel anointed David.
