



## REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. God told Samuel to do something for Him and to stop grieving for Saul. What did God want Samuel to do? *(Go to Bethlehem and anoint one of Jesse's sons as the new king.)*
2. When Jesse's seven sons came and stood before Samuel, what did Samuel think about the oldest son, Eliab? *(He thought Eliab must be the one God had chosen because he was the oldest and was tall and handsome.)*
3. What did God say to Samuel about choosing the new king? *(God said how a person looks on the outside is not as important as what is in his heart.)*
4. Which one of Jesse's seven older sons did God choose as king? *(None of them.)*
5. What was the name of Jesse's youngest son? *(David.)*
6. What was David's job? *(He was a shepherd and took care of sheep.)*
7. Why had David not been called to the feast? *(The youngest was not considered very important.)*
8. What is a person after God's heart like? *(They do things with the right motivation, caring about the things God cares about.)*
9. What does it mean that God is omniscient? *(God knows everything.)*
10. What are some ways you can care about the things God cares about? *(Answers will vary.)*
11. How can you be saved from sin's punishment? *(Believe the Lord Jesus died for me and receive Him as my Savior from sin.)*
12. How can Psalm 119:9-10 help you remember God sees your heart? *(It can help me remember to seek God with my whole heart and not wander from His commandments.)*



## PRESCHOOL REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. How many sons came before Samuel that God said, "No, he's not the king"? *(Seven sons.)*
2. What was the name of Jesse's youngest son? *(David.)*
3. What was David's job? *(He was a shepherd.)*
4. Why did Jesus die on the cross and rise again? *(To take away our sins.)*

### Review Game

"What's in Your Heart?"

#### Materials:

"Right Hearts" reproducible  
 "What's in Your Heart?" reproducible  
 "Wrong Hearts" reproducible  
 (See GNC Resource Pack.)

Container for each team  
 Bag

#### Instructions:

Prepare a container with a picture of a heart on it for each team. Write down eight right heart and five wrong heart attitudes on small pieces of paper and put them in a bag. When a child answers a question, he may choose a paper from the bag. If it is something good that should be in our hearts he can keep it and put it in his team's heart container. If it is something bad, he should return it to the bag. As you alternate between the teams, reinforce the teaching that God cares about what's in our hearts. Once all questions have been asked, count the right heart attitudes in each team's heart container to see who got the most!

#### Right Heart

Love, kindness, patient, helpful, joyful, good, obedient, thankful

#### Wrong Heart

Complaining, hate, disobedient, angry, jealous

### Preschool Review Game

"What's In Your Heart? Junior"

#### Materials:

Container with heart on it  
 Attribute cards

#### Instructions:

Prepare a container with a picture of a heart on it and cards that list good attributes that we should have in our hearts. When a child answers a question, let him pick one of the cards and put it in the heart container after you read it out loud and remind the children that this is something God wants to see in our hearts.
