



REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. What enemy was invading the land of Israel? (*The Philistines.*)
2. Why were the Israelites afraid of Goliath? (*He was a giant; he threatened them.*)
3. What should the Israelites have remembered instead of letting their fear of Goliath control them? (*That they were the people of the living God, who is stronger than any giant.*)
4. Why did Goliath's threats make David angry? (*Because Goliath was defying God and His people.*)
5. Tell me two things you know about God. (*Answers will vary.*)
6. What does it mean that Jesus is the champion? (*Jesus won over sin and death.*)
7. What did King Saul offer to David to help him fight Goliath? (*His armor.*)
8. What did David tell King Saul to convince him he could beat Goliath? (*David told him how God had helped him in the past and how he was trusting God now.*)
9. What did David shout to Goliath before he ran toward him? (*"That all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel!"*)
10. What was one thing God wanted to show the nations about Himself? (*That He is the one true God.*)
11. What is one way you can be bold for God's glory this week? (*Answers will vary.*)
12. What can you remember to help you be bold for God's glory? (*Remember who God is, remember who I am, remember Jesus also suffered but obeyed God.*)



PRESCHOOL REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. Why were the Israelites so afraid of the Philistines? (*One of their soldiers was a giant named Goliath.*)
2. Why could David kill Goliath? (*He trusted God, and God helped him.*)
3. Who is the champion over sin? (*Jesus!*)
4. How can you have your sins forgiven? (*By believing in Jesus as my Savior.*)

Review Game "GIANT Steps"

Instructions:

This game can be played in teams or in one large group. Set a start and finish line at the front of the room. When a child correctly answers a question, have him come to the starting line then take the biggest step he can possibly take toward the finish line. Have him freeze in place until another child from his team answers a question and comes to take his place. Have the next child start where the previous child was standing and take a giant step toward the finish line. Continue playing in this way until a child crosses the finish line.

Variation:

If you do not have sufficient space for the children to take giant steps, use a stuffed animal or other toy at the front of the room as a mascot for each team. Make a card that says "Giant Step" on one side and "Little Step" on the other. When a child correctly answers a question, let him toss the card in the air, whichever side lands facing up indicates how big of a step their mascot can take. The team's mascot that makes it furthest wins!

Preschool Review Game "GIANT Steps Junior"

Have the children stand at one end of the room while a teacher stands at the other. When a child correctly answers a question, all the children may take one giant step toward the teacher. Continue asking questions until the children reach the teacher. If time permits, have children return to the starting line and play again!
