

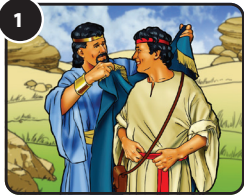

A. Slide 1 (1 Samuel 18:1-4; 20:42)

1. David and King Saul's son Jonathan became friends.
2. David and Jonathan made an important promise to each other.



B. Slide 2 (1 Samuel 18:5-9)

1. Saul became jealous of David.
 Jesus always went God's way and always did, said, and thought right and good things. That is why He could take the punishment for your sin. [2 Corinthians 5:21a]

2. David tried to hide from Saul.
3. Many men joined David.



C. Slide 3 (1 Samuel 24:1-3) David and his men lived in caves.



D. Slide 4 (Word Up!)

-  You might be worried and feel like everything is out of control, but God is completely trustworthy. [Isaiah 55:8-9]



E. Slide 5

1. David and his men experienced many hard times as they tried to stay ahead of Saul's army.
2. Saul went into the cave where David and his men were hiding!



F. Slide 6 (1 Samuel 24:4-7)

1. David's men encourage David to kill King Saul.
2. David cut off the corner of King Saul's robe.
3. David realized he should not have done even that much to the one God had anointed.



G. **Slide 7** (Word Up!)



God loves you, and you can trust Him. When you start to worry, stop and think about how God has worked things out in the past. [Romans 8:28]



H. **Slide 8** (1 Samuel 24:8-22)

1. David followed Saul to the entrance of the cave.
2. David showed Saul the piece of Saul's robe he had cut off.
3. Saul realized he was wrong but he hadn't really changed.
4. David found a new hiding place.



I. **Slide 9**

Saul continued being jealous and trying to kill David for ten years.

III. **CLIMAX**

But David would not kill Saul because he was trusting in God's plan and waiting for God's timing for him to become king.



E. **Slide 10** (Word Up!)
