1. What promise did David and Jonathan make to each other?
(*To always care for each other's families.*)
2. Why was King Saul so jealous of David? (*Because David had become a popular hero.*)
3. Why did David and his men need to run from place to place and hide in caves?
(*King Saul was trying to kill David.*)
4. Where did King Saul and his men choose to stop when they arrived at Engedi? (*In the same cave where David and his men were hiding.*)
5. What are some times when it is hard to trust God's plan for you?
(*Answers will vary.*)
6. What did David's men encourage David to do when Saul was alone in the cave with them? (*To kill Saul and make himself king of Israel.*)
7. What did David do? (*He snuck up and cut off a piece of Saul's robe, proving he was close enough to have killed him.*)
8. What can you do when it is hard to trust God's plan? (*Remember who God is; thank God for being with me; ask God to help me trust Him.*)
9. Why did David not kill Saul when he had the chance? (*Because David was trusting God's plan and was waiting for God to make him king.*)
10. True or false: After what happened in the cave, King Saul stopped chasing David and trying to kill him. (*False; he kept trying to kill him for ten years.*)
11. What does Psalm 119:11 say you should hide (store) in your heart?
(*God's Word.*)
12. What is God's plan for you to be saved from your sin?
(*Believe on Jesus as my Savior.*)

Review Game "ZERO—Heart Edition"

Materials:
"ZERO—Heart Edition" cards
(See GNC Resource Pack.)
Bag or other container

Instructions:
Prepare brightly colored hearts with various point values on them. Put the hearts in a container along with several hearts that have "ZERO" written on them. When a child correctly answers a question, allow him to reach into the container as many times as he wants to pull out hearts and win points for his team, but if he gets a "ZERO" heart his team loses all the points from that round and his turn is over. Put all the hearts back into the container and continue playing alternating between the teams.

Variation: "Speed ZERO"
Rather than allowing the child to reach into the container multiple times; he may only reach in once, but may grab as many hearts as he wants in that one turn. Add up the points on the chosen hearts and award them to his team—unless there is a "ZERO" heart, then no points are won.

Preschool Review Game "ZERO Junior—Heart Edition"

Prepare brightly colored hearts with various point values on them. Put the hearts in a container along with several hearts that have "ZERO" written on them. Everyone plays together on the same team. When a child correctly answers a question, allow him to choose one heart for the team. If he gets points, have everyone clap their hands. If he gets a ZERO heart, have everyone jump up and down. Continue playing until every child has had a turn if possible.
