



REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. Why was Mephibosheth in danger? (*His father and grandfather were dead; the new king would usually kill everyone in the former king's family.*)
2. What happened when Mephibosheth and his nurse tried to run away? (*His nurse dropped him; he hurt his feet and legs.*)
3. How are you and I in a hopeless situation? (*We were born in sin.*)
4. Who became the new king? (*David.*)
5. What promise did David and Jonathan make to each other? (*They would show kindness to each other's families.*)
6. If you have believed on Jesus, how does God want you to treat others? (*He wants me to show His kindness to others.*)
7. How does God show His kindness to you? (*He forgives my sins if I believe on Jesus as Savior; answers may vary.*)
8. What did Jesus do for you to save you from the hopelessness of your sin? (*He died on the cross; He took the punishment for my sin.*)
9. How did David show kindness to Mephibosheth? (*David gave him a place at his table and gave back all his land.*)
10. How can you be part of God's forever family? (*Believe on His name; trust Him to save me from the punishment of sin.*)
11. If you are a child of God, where will you live forever after you are finished living on earth? (*Heaven.*)
12. According to our memory verse, what should you do with God's Word and why? (*Hide it in my heart; memorize it; because knowing God's Word will help me to not sin.*)



PRESCHOOL REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. What sad thing happened to Mephibosheth? (*He hurt his feet; his dad and grandpa died; he lost his home.*)
2. How was David kind to Mephibosheth? (*He gave him land; he let him eat at the king's table; he treated him like a son.*)
3. How did God show His love for you? (*He sent His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross.*)
4. How can you be kind to others? (*Answers will vary.*)

Review Game

"Set The King's Table"

Materials:

"David's Table" reproducible
(See GNC Resource Pack.)

String

Instructions:

David showed kindness to Mephibosheth by having him eat at his table. Let the children pretend to set the table for dinner with the king.

Prepare a set of dishes and silverware for each team (or use pictures of forks, spoons, plates, bowls, cups and napkins). Put these things (or the pictures of them) on the floor or, if possible, a table at the front of the room. Use a string to divide the table in half and place a complete set of all items on each team's side. Tell the children that each item has a secret point value and some of the items will actually take points away from their team. When a child correctly answers a question, he may either take an object from the other team's side and put it on his team's side in an attempt to get points or move an object from his team's side to the other team's side in an attempt to get rid of negative points. After all questions have been asked, reveal the secret point values of each item and see who has the most positive points to win!

Suggested Points:

Napkins= +5

Plates= +3

Cups= +2

Forks= -3

Spoons= -2

Butter knives= -1

Preschool Review Game

"Set The King's Table Junior"

Put a set of plastic dishes and silverware in a container (or use pictures of forks, spoons, plates, bowls, cups and napkins). When a child correctly answers a question, have everyone cheer while he chooses something from the container and sets it on a table (or on a tablecloth placed on the floor). If possible, let every child have a turn helping to set the table.
