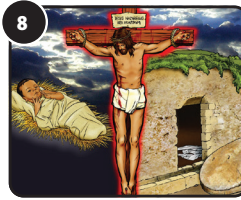


F. **Slide 6** (2 Samuel 7:11-17; 1 Kings 2:10-12; Luke 1:26-33)

2. God had promised that David's throne would last forever.
